I was particularly excited about the 2010 show because Porsche was debuting two new 997s: the Carrera GTS and the limited-edition 997 Speedster. What wasn't widely advertised was the unveiling of the new Cayman R, as well.



The new Carreras were surrounded by Panameras, newly designed Cayennes, a Black Boxster Spyder, a classic Slate Grey 997 Targa, and the GT3 Hybrid race car! My camera actually started to overheat a little bit.

The Friday morning PCNA Party that Pam & I attended was an invitation-only event, populated by less than 100 people, meaning there was plenty of opportunity to examine and sit in every model. And, unusually, every single car (less the GT3 Hybrid) was open for business.

The entire show commenced at 11:00 a.m. and we were among the first to enter. Beating the crowds, thanks to the pre-opening Porsche party, gave us the chance to inspect everything before it got too crowded. In no particular order, I was most impressed with the Chevy Volt, the new Subaru Impreza concept, and the MINI Cooper four-door Countryman. There were hybrids everywhere, from the all electric Nissan Leaf, to the surprisingly economical Porsche Cayenne Hybrid. "Green" apparently is the new black.



A Rockin' Good Trip To The Nethercutt

ur 9:00 a.m. rendezvous brought out Porsches from the 80s, 90s and some of the newer, faster, water-cooled models. All together, 29 cars and 46 semi-soaked club members were ready for some fun and a new adventure or two. The weather this particular Saturday morning was rainy and ominous and at times reminded me of my years in Portland OR, but the precipitation soon would prove beneficial at our first stop, the Rock Store Café.

With rain falling at a rate defying exaggeration, the all important drivers' meeting consisted of a final head count and distributing directions for those needing them. We quickly departed on the first leg of the day's adventure led by our event hosts John Cliff and Joelle Saxson in John's race-track ready grand prix white 1983 Porsche 911 Targa. Driving distance was approximately 30 miles with over 437 turns, or so it seemed. Fortunately for me, I got to drive Doreen Pankow's beloved 1990 911 C2 which had recently taken second place in its class at the club's most

recent Concours d'Elegance. We headed southbound on Los Posas Road, onto Hueneme Road, and then east on Potrero Road to Mulholland Highway. This is a drive one could easily do after a Saturday morning Camarillo breakfast meeting. I was asked to drive the "sweep position," or last in the group, to help with any stragglers or breakdowns, and I quickly determined the only one really needing help was ME! The window defoggers wouldn't work to clear the glass of all the moisture in the car. So with rag in hand, I almost drove off the road while steering with the other hand and wiping the inside of my totally obscured windshield every 5 seconds or so, all while wearing a pair of totally soaked blue jeans. Now, the uphill twisties on Westlake Boulevard are especially fun in the wet, but throw in no visibility and you've got a drive you will not soon forget, nor wish to ever repeat.

Next, a nice downhill drive across Mulholland Highway to the first stop of the day, the Rock Store Café for breakfast, some good conversation, and fun with fellow Porsche enthusiasts. The mixed blessing from the morning's heavy rains meant no motorcycles on the road, so we had the entire Rock Store Café to ourselves. A normal Saturday morning at The Rock Store would find the restaurant filled with patrons, and the parking lot, such as it is, crammed with motorcycles of every description. The rain had done us a favor

The Rock Store Café is owned and operated by Ed and Vern (Veronica) Savko, and has become an iconic stop for all motorcycle riders along famous Mulholland Highway. The Rock Store is a trip back in time as everything is pretty much as it was in the 60s, and it's open for business only on Friday, Saturday and Sunday. The food is prepared just the way your mother made it, and regardless of whether you're having breakfast or lunch, there's no need to rush when you're here. After finishing a delicious breakfast, it was time for the famous group picture. This time we all positioned ourselves on the front porch steps of the Rock Store, proving even Porsche people find this place a fun spot to visit and experience. Thank you, Ed and Vern, for all your hospitality and good food.





With John's '83 Targa in need of gas, I was asked to lead the group on to our final destination, the Nethercutt Museum. Fortunately, the rains had stopped, and this leg of the trip seemed more normal, since my window glass was no longer fogging up. As the skies began to clear, the final 20-mile leg was via freeways, and was uneventful with all cars arriving safely at our final stop, the famous Nethercutt Museum in Sylmar.

The Nethercutt Museum showcases more than 130 of the world's greatest antique, vintage, classic and special interest automobiles, including many top winners of the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance. All the automobiles on display list manufacturer, year, engine size and original cost new. Every automobile










actually runs and has its key in the ignition ready to start and drive. All the automobiles and musical player pianos in this massive collection have been restored on site by the Nethercutt's own journeyman staff of old world craftsmen. The Nethercutt Museum in Sylmar is a definite must-see collection of early automobiles and mechanical musical devices that never disappoints the viewer. The price is right, too, as admission is free! Kudos to John Cliff and Joelle Saxson for putting together two great places to see and explore, along with a super fun drive all of us can now do whenever we want. Thank you as well to all the attendees for driving safely and behaving themselves. And finally, thanks to all of you who answered my email requesting your support on this event. I hope to see you at our next event which is just around the corner.



Come join us for a fun-filled trip over the 2011 Memorial Day weekend where you will see, explore and touch some of the most majestic and awesome red rock and sandstone formations in America.

We will depart the morning of Friday, May 27 and travel north on CA Hwy 14, then east across the Pear Blossom Hwy and north on the I-15. Friday evening, an Italian buffet dinner will be held on the patio of the Switchback Grille with views of the Court of the Patriarchs, the West Temple and other notable landmarks.

On Saturday, we will explore Zion National Park, a vertical sandstone world with miles of serpentine slot canyons and immense quietude. These unique sandstone cliffs range in color from cream, to pink, to red. They could be described as sand castles crowning desert canyons. Designated in 1919, Zion is Utah's oldest National Park.

At the Zion NP entry and Visitor Center, we will catch the Zion Canyon free shuttle. The driver will describe the various monuments, sites and trails as we drive through the park. We will be able to get off

and on the bus at multiple stops throughout the park to explore the scenery. Have your camera and plenty of batteries ready as the photo ops are everywhere you turn once inside the park. Zion offers many paths and hiking trails that range from short "leg stretchers" to longer hikes, so bring your hiking shoes and sunscreen. We plan to organize a group to hike up to the famous Angels Landing, elevation 10,000+ feet. The Angels Landing hike we guarantee will be one you'll never forget. The Lodge in the center of the park offers lunch and snack items including ice cream cones, along with a large lovely lawn with trees to relax under and a gift shop to browse. At the end of the day we will all meet for cocktails and dinner at the Pioneer Restaurant in Springdale.

On Sunday after a delicious buffet breakfast, we will depart early to drive 86 miles to Bryce Canyon NP. The 9E route will take us over some

twisty roads and through the onemile-long Zion tunnel. We will then cut through the park's Checkerboard Mesa area which ends at Hwy 89 at Mt. Carmel Junction. We will head north on Hwy 89, then east on Hwy 12 through the beautiful Red Canyon area and on into Bryce Canyon National Park.

Bryce Canyon's elevation ranges from 8000-9000 feet, meaning temperatures could be on the cool side, and the canyon itself is about 800 feet deep. Within the park, we will stop at over a dozen view points to see the breathtaking views and photo ops, all within a short walking distance. Your eyes won't believe this spectacle of nature is actually possible. Forces of nature have conspired over millions of years to wear away these stunning rock castles. The intricate spires and formations, known as hoodoos, defy your imagination. There are also trails down into the canyons where you can experience walking through the hoodoos. Hiking the trail between Sunset and Sunrise view points is well worth the effort. Dinner will be on your own. There is a great restaurant just outside the park, or you can have dinner back in Springdale.

Monday will be an optional day for those who want to stay and explore more sights and avoid the holiday traffic. Just relax in Springdale or take a side trip to Zion Kolob Canyons, the North Rim of the Grand Canyon or other sites.

If you are interested in participating in this action packed weekend, register with Ted Lighthizer & Doreen Pankow at dpankow@ sbcglobal.net or 805-527-8280. Rates for rooms with a king size bed are \$107.10 per night plus tax, or with two queen size beds it's \$103.50 per night plus tax. The fee for the entire





nly a couple of hours to the northeast is a military installation that is unique, the only one of its kind in the world. We are writing about Edwards Air Force Base and its partner/neighbor NASA's Dryden Research Center, located in Rosamond, CA. Thirty-six R.U.F.ians toured the facility on November 18, 2010 to witness America's air might and aeronautic superiority. It was an experience no one who participated will ever forget.

The enormous facility is spread out over parts of Los Angeles and Kern Counties. The dry lakebed that serves as a mammoth landing strip inside its borders is over 44 square miles! Believe it or not, the lakebed can be seen and identified by astronauts while circumnavigating the globe from as far away as Guam! Currently, Edwards is home to more than 50 military and civilian test programs. We were allowed access to practically all non-secret areas of Edwards and Dryden, including some sites normally closed to civilian visitors.

decades as Army Air Base, Muroc Lake. Then, in 1948, something terrible happened.

Defense contractor Northrop built the YB-49 Flying Wing and was testing it at Muroc. One of its test pilots, Captain Glen W. Edwards, wrote in his diary that it was "the damdest (sic) airplane I've ever tried to do anything with." On June 5, 1948 he was among those lost in the crash of the YB-49 when it departed controlled flight and broke apart. On December 8, 1949 Muroc Air Force Base was renamed in his honor. (Between 1948 and 1958, no less than 68 airmen lost their lives in accidents at Edwards.)

We were pleased and honored to be joined on our tour by Air Force Colonel Glenn Graham, who has served with distinction in Desert Storm, Iraqi Freedom and Afghanistan. Our very own Commander (Ret.) John Shutt served in Viet Nam, flying A4 and A6 fighters from the decks of aircraft carriers. The Colonel and the Commander had an opportunity to share moments to which only comrades-in-arms are entitled.

Edwards AFB Welcomes R.U.F.



R.U.F.ians suffered mightily for the privilege. We met prior to 7:00 a.m. in Santa Clarita. Those traveling from Santa Barbara had to leave their homes by 5:30. Our arrival at the West Gate at Edwards was just before 8:30, and our tour guide (Dennis Shoffner) arrived in an Air Force bus 15 minutes later. First, Dennis gave us a brief history of Edwards, the why and how it was developed in this most remote location. It started interestingly enough in April 1910 when the Corum brothers and their families settled on 160 acres in what is now known as Rogers Dry Lake. They recruited other settlers and sold them land for \$1/acre and when they moved in, the Corums were waiting with their new general store, post office and equipment to drill wells and clear the land. They wanted to name their new town "Corum" but the postal authorities declined since it would be confused with "Coram" California. So, they simply reversed the spelling and came up with "Muroc." Once the Army Air Corp established its base in the area, it was known for It was a surreal beginning of the tour as our bus had to stop prior to entering the runway apron to check its tires – not for wear or flats, but for any debris that might be found stuck in its treads. The slightest FOD, foreign object debris, could enter a jet engine causing massive damage to machines and humans. As that was being done, a military fighter jet took off; it was a Russian MIG! No one told us how a MIG wound up in American hands at Edwards. Our driving tour resumed, and we witnessed a B-52 being washed! The bomber made its debut when Harry Truman was President and has served our nation for seven decades. Another B-52 on the base had served as the "mother ship" that carried the supersonic X-15 to over 60 thousand feet before releasing it to ignite its own rockets and disappear into the heavens. One of three X-15s built was on display for us to marvel.

The X-15 had its inaugural flight in September 1959. By 1969, it flew in excess of Mach 4, 2,905 mph at 75 thousand feet. By

November of that year, it climbed to 100,000 feet at 3,603 mph. In August 1963, the airplane reached altitude of 354,200 feet – 67 miles above the earth's surface – and in 1967 the X-15 flew at Mach 6.7 (4,520 mph) at 102,000 feet. It remains to this date the highest speed ever attained in a piloted aircraft.

There were, of course, numerous new aircraft, including the soon to be operational F-35 that will replace the F-16 (one of which thundered overhead as it took off). The most modern fighter jet now in operation is the F-22 (cruise speed of 1,500 mph) and it was alongside the gigantic C-17 transport. Unmanned aircraft was present as well, and we got up close and personal with the Global Hawk that can fly for 38 hours without refueling while providing critical intelligence, reconnaissance and support services.

The National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) occupies a large portion of Edwards. The Space Shuttle program has a presence, as do dozens of programs not necessarily engaged in space exploration. We did, however, observe the modified Boeing

747 used to transport shuttles back to Kennedy Space Center in Florida, and learned how the shuttle is lifted to sit on top of the mother plane.

A 16-minute movie gave us the background on how NASA's predecessor, NACA (National Advisory Committee on Aeronautics) morphed into the world's grandest flight and exploration outfit. We were introduced to the actual model used to construct the lunar landing and recovery vehicle (LLRV) that was employed by Neil Armstrong on man's first landing on the moon. There were many other displays and exhibits of NASA vehicles and heroes, too many to list or describe here. Our last stop was the Air Force Museum where still more memorabilia and exhibits described life on earth, in the skies and in the heavens.

Our 36 members were deeply impressed with the entire facility and all its wonderful content. The day could not have been more informative, and the weather was made to order.
